This 40 hour free program, Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) is a best practice model for transforming community responses to behavioral health crises. CIT is designed to bring law enforcement, behavioral health professionals, advocates and other partners together to respond to behavioral health crises by working together and utilizing resources in the community to aid so that police and jails are not the default responders and locations.

The training educates law enforcement and other first responders on topics such as behavioral health diagnoses, understanding persons with developmental disabilities, responses to suicide threats and current medications used to treat the most prevalent medical conditions and utilizes first person narratives to illustrate and explain the nature of behavioral health crises.

- Class is limited to 28 participants.
- Deadline to register is **November 9, 2022**
- Certificates will be awarded to candidates completing the entire program.
